TOMORROW is the first of our parent open mornings (Tuesday 7th to Thursday 9th March) and we're looking forward to meeting up with parents/carers and getting you involved in maths, reading and English lessons. I hope you've been brushing up on times tables and know your past progressive tense from your future perfect!

Don't worry if you don't, but we would encourage you to get as involved as you can. I know that our marvellous office manager, Ms Price, has been in contact with all of you who have registered to come along. We may be able to squeeze some more of you in on the day, but be aware that we have limited space so it's difficult to guarantee. If you arrive and haven't booked, if we can't fit you in, we will try our best to get you in for a subsequent day. These days have proven very popular over recent years, and will be held again around this time next year, so as Billy Butlin (I think) used to say—please book early to avoid disappointment.

If you're booked in, please report to the office; we'll get you signed in, I'll run through the events of the morning then we'll despatch you around the school. We'll have a break for tea/coffee and also a short presentation on Growth Mindset, which is really working well with kids this year.

I hope you all managed to attend last week for parents' evening, and found it useful. If you weren't able to attend, please try and arrange a time to meet your child's teacher over the coming weeks. They'll be chasing you too... as we do feel that parental involvement and communication is a vital part of every child's education.

Thank you so much to those of you who completed a questionnaire. We are knocked out with the positive feedback (see page three for full details). Of course, we are always open to suggestions and — as per one or two suggestions about recognising pupils for their achievement as well as good behaviour, I just want to take some space to explain what we already do and what we will do in response to that...

Each Monday we award a 'Star of the Week' award to a child in each class. The reason for this award is always listed on the certificate: sometimes it is simply for excellent or improved behaviour but frequently it recognises excellent or improved work, and/or one of our Values. Each week each class teacher sends out a 'Well done' card to one child who has worked hard, produced their best work or been a role model. Also, and this is my favourite part of the week, I am joined at the 'Head's Table' by a child from each class (Y1-6) who have either shone in their achievement or behaviour. They also receive a certificate explaining why they have been chosen.

Can I also remind parents/carers that we are very keen to celebrate children's achievements outside of school. If your young un' has gained a swimming medal, dance or gymnastics certificate, Brownie or Cubs badge or anything similar, we'd love to present their award in assembly on a Monday morning. Please join us if you can... No notice required, just bring the award and let the office ladies know.

Finally, we're having our World Book Day celebration on 17th March, to tie in with our book fair—when children can spend their World Book Day book voucher, which all will receive. There seems to be quite an internet industry in World Book Day costumes, but I'd like to emphasise for parents/carers not to spend a fortune. If you can do a Blue Peter with a simple home-made costume, that would be great. While we will give out some small prizes, the day is meant to be fun and a celebration of reading, so please don't let it be another worry: what with global warming, the kids asking you what a fronted adverbial is for homework and the continuing battle to keep your little darlings entertained, we know you've got enough on your plate already! Attendance

The whole school target for attendance is **96.5%.** From the start of the school year until now, our attendance since September is **95.08%**. Please continue to help us to ensure that children are getting the best possible education by making sure that children are in school, where possible.

Well done to Year 2 Bich whose attendance was 99.60% last week

The classes which was the **most punctual** last week were **Reception Birch**. Well done to them! They win our Early Bird Bears for the week.

We continue to have an issue with lateness and attendance. Last week we had 36 incidents of lateness and **our overall attendance** is **below the national average of 95.6%**. These figures are a clearly detrimental to our pupils' education. Letters have gone out to parents/carers whose children's attendance is below 90%. We are over halfway through the year and 90% is equivalent to missing half a day's education every week. Please help us to improve this.

Class Corner - Year 4 Oak

Year 4 Oak have made a fantastic start to the half term. We have particularly enjoyed our new topic 'in a state' where we have been exploring the properties of solids, liquids and gases. Last week, we investigated how temperature affects the speed at which ice melts by putting ice cubes in different areas of the class-room and recording the time it took them to melt. Strangely, it took the ice cubes over half an hour to turn from a solid to a liquid!

Over the next few weeks, we will be focusing on The Vikings and identifying why the Vikings invaded Britain. We are also going to be exploring many different artefacts and suggesting uses for these objects. Finally, 4 Oak have started a new topic in RE (Salvation) and we are excited to find out more information over the next few weeks. Best wishes,
