A problem for farmers...



Impacts of changing climates



Many farmers in Nepal grow their crops on the mountainside areas where the land is fertile.

However, the **markets** where farmers can get a **good price** for their produce (including their tomatoes) are at the bottom of the mountain on the other side of the river.

It's often a hard three hour walk down steep and dangerous paths and the produce often gets squashed on the journey.



Practical Action works with people living in Bangladesh who experience some of the worst effects of climate change.

- Floods affect over 1 million people in Bangladesh and last longer each year.
- Many families lose their crops and the vegetables they were growing to feed their families.





World Food Day is an event promoted by the United Nations to raise awareness of food and food security and this year it falls on Monday 16th October. Food security - the availability and accessibility of food - is an issue that affects everyone.

This year we think about how people are forced to move away from their homes because of farming problems.
