The new term is fully started now and I would like to welcome all the new Reception children and their families to St Saviour's. Last week we had a fire drill at lunchtime, I am very pleased with the pupils in their fast response time in evacuating the building and meeting at their new allocated places but unfortunately the alarm was set off by a pupil. I have spoken to all the children regarding the seriousness of setting off the alarm and ask that you also discuss this too, especially as the fire brigade have to investigate the false call out.

Last week saw the start of our soft start to the day. Children are allowed to enter their classrooms (Yr 1 – 6) from 8.45am. This does not mean school starts at 8.45am. SCHOOL STARTS AT 9am. We had a number of children arriving earlier than 8.45am and this means they are unsupervised. If your child arrives after 9am and the classroom door is closed you must take your child to the main school office to enter. We had a number of parents banging on the door.
