A message from Remi Year 6 Birch:

This week in Year 6 we were learning about cells in Science. I really enjoyed how we were looking through a microscope (a piece of tech that zooms in to small objects). When I looked through the microscope, I noticed that even the smallest of things are fascinating. We were looking at a layer of an onion and it had a lot of things:

- Cytoplasm
- Nucleus cit stores all the DNA;
- And the cell wall

Of course, we enjoyed all the other subjects as well, such as Maths. We are becoming more fluent in using written methods to solve multi-step problems.

We were learning on how to apply ratio as a starter to the lesson. In literacy, we have been working on compound-complex sentences and responded to the book Goodnight Mister Tom.

I am really enjoying the book because it's about a city boy getting used to the countryside with an elderly man and a dog.

This also links into our topic WW2. We are learning about how a man like Hitler could persuade others to vote him into power. Did you know that when Germany got its fire power back WW1, people in Britain had to build air raid shelters to protect themselves?

A message from Yaacoub and Adrian Year 5

In Year 5 we have introduced a new science resource.

Last week in Year 5 we learnt about Science. In Science we talked about the Earth. In the beginning of Science we were talking about the different layers of Earth.

They are:

- The mantle
- The core
- The outer core

We used a marble for the core and we used plasticine for the layers.

We also did an experiment using toast and tomato soup, which helped us to investigate that the heat in the core, separated the continents on the Earth.

Before it was separated the Earth was just one continent.
