Dear Parent/Carer and Governors,

This year, Advent begins on Sunday, 2nd December as this is the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day. In our assemblies, we will be discussing Advent (from the Latin word "adventus", which translates as 'coming' or 'arrival'), which marks the waiting and preparation for the birth of Jesus, and children will reflect on the importance and spirituality of this season.

As we reach December, there's no denying that Christmas is in the air. Walking around the school, I can hear the children in Year 1 and 2 rehearsing for the Nativity which will be Thursday, 13th December; Reception practising for their carol service on Monday, 17th December; and our Christmas tree has gone up in the hall. We are still on the lookout for someone to be Father Christmas in Santa's Grotto at the Christmas Fair next week. If you know anyone who can do this (or can be persuaded to do this) for a couple of hours on a Friday afternoon, do please let the office know. We are also looking for volunteers to run other stalls so please let us know if you are available on that day.

On a different note, it has come to my attention that there have been a number of incidents happening on Markhouse Road and I know how this can impact on journeys to and from school. However, I am also concerned about the safety of children, particularly

regarding the cycle path, and would like to remind everyone to be extra vigilant and keep safe. If there are any concerns, please let us know and these can be passed on to the Local Authority. A polite reminder also that cars should not be stopping or parking in the yellow zig-zag lines outside of school. Thank you for your cooperation.

Finally, the number of children arriving at school has been reduced and the morning bagel has been very popular. Could I ask that if your child is absent from school that you let the school office know as soon as possible. The final few weeks at school this term are just as important as the beginning of the term and so it is so important your child is in school.

A week in review



Learning in Year 5

This week in year 5 we have enjoyed learning about capacity and volume. In DT we looked at different cam mechanisms and have begun to design our own toy. We have also been learning about food webs and food chains in science.

Learning in Reception

We are having lots of fun listening to our new story of the week, "The Jolly Postman". The boys and girls are looking forward to our school trip to the library this week. We will have a special story session as well as a craft workshop to decorate Christmas cards to send home to our families.

Learning in Year 1

In Year 1 Willow we have been learning about fractions in Maths.

For Big Write we have been creating our own stories about Traction Man, the superhero.

In RE we have been learning about gifts and giving, as Christmas approaches we have also been rehearsing our Christmas songs and our Christmas play.

In Science, we have been exploring materials and this week we have learnt about the properties of water and ice.

Learning in Year 6

In Year 6 last week, pupils had the opportunity to explore chemical compounds in Science and represented these using plasticine models. They used the periodic table to identify the different elements which make up different compounds and explored the most common uses of these.

Pupils enjoyed reading a bit more of 'The Hobbit' and learnt various report writing skills in order to write a non-chronological report about dragons. We look forward to reading the final product this Friday.

Learning in Year 4

Last week the favourite thing that happened in Year 4 Oak was that Miss McLean bought a class hamster which was a baby girl. The hamster's name is Betty. Miss McLean bought a house for her in the cage and it also had a bed. We learnt that hamsters store food in their chubby cheeks and put it in their homes until winter. Our hamster is a Russian Dwarf hamster.
