## Weekly Newsletter

Dear Parent/Carer,

So, everyone survived the first few days back at school last week in one piece - which has got to be good! It's feeling very seasonal: wet or icy mornings, breath condensing in the frosty air, parakeets flying overhead...

Yes, I can't figure that out that either. I did hear they escaped from a house bordering Hampstead Heath and have slowly spread out as far as Walthamstow. They seem to be coping well with the cold (better than me anyway) and regularly bring some welcome colour to the winter sky.

With the change in weather, our lovely field is no longer suitable for children to walk on, as it is constantly sodden and very muddy. Please could you help by not letting your children play on the field or any of the muddy parts around the playground in the mornings as this is brought into the school and messes up the carpets. Mr Parker does a sterling job keeping our corridors and carpet clean but cannot cope with four hundred+ pairs of muddy feet in the morning.

Recently, there have been some changes to our homework policy, particularly online home learning such as Bug Club, as we strive to improve learning experiences at home. Homework is a fantastic way for parents/ carers to support their child's learning – I know from our parent surveys and discussion with parents and teachers that this is an important matter for some parents - although it is of more limited value for teachers.

We have decided to focus on web-based homework – where feedback on answers is given immediately, rather than waiting the best part of a week before feedback can be given. We will be sending out a letter by Thursday (homework setting day) summarising the changes so that you are fully aware of what there is available to support your child.

As per our arrangements last term, those children who do not have online access at home will be able to access homework during our Friday lunchtime homework club or, if they attend, at Tea Time Club.

Year 6 clubs are starting this week and other clubs will be starting up again next week. A letter was sent last week informing parents about this so please ensure you let the office know before Wednesday if you wish your child to sign up for a club.

Finally, if you are available in the afternoons, and would like to be a volunteer reader, please speak to Ms Tolliday or ask the office to pass on a message. We always welcome parents who can support children with extra reading. If you can do an afternoon a week, we will provide the children! Have a great week. Breakfast and Tea Time Club continue as usual.




#### Spare school uniform


If you have any unwanted uniform for children under 6 years please could you donate this to our preschool team, this will include pants/knickers. If you had it into the office we will pass it on for you.

Are you one of the children? Or an older brother or sister? We're talking over 46 years ago now, so most of these kids will be well into their 50s. Some may even be grandparents!

Please let us know if you know anything about this special opening day. We think the school may have been in residence in 1970, but that the opening day was in 1971. The school originally began in 1890, in a building funded by a Richard Foster—who also funded a permanent building for St Barnabas Church in 1903. Any information would be gratefully received!


