





Dear Parents and Carers

Last week was a very busy week that included some very enriching experiences for the children across the school.

To start the week, Children in key stage 1 and 2 were treated to a very humorous presentation from a theatre group based on the famous Phileas Fogg character from 'Around the World in Eighty Days.' It involved a lot of audience participation, some raucous singing and an elephant dance involving all the children in the hall.

There was also A French workshop for Year 5 that involved a retelling of the famous fairy tale 'Little Red Riding Hood' where the children had to dress up and act out the story using French to convey the story. I am told, by Mrs Morris, that the children's acting was 'phenomenal,' they learned a lot of new vocabulary and had an immense amount of fun in the process.

As part of our everyday language in school, we frequently refer to our school values. Tenacity, in particular, is the one that is often referred to in the context of learning. On Friday, we had a special guest in our school, Dominic Mensah, a GBR Tumbling gymnast, who spoke passionately about his career in this field and was the very embodiment of this value. He told the children about the sacrifices he has made in order to reach his goal of becoming the world tumbling champion; as a twelve-year old, he was driven for over an hour a day after school to get to a training ground, then trained for 2-3 hours every day for four years. What was so inspiring about his words was his strong belief that anyone can achieve their goals if they have the desire and are prepared to put in the hard

work. He also talked about the setbacks that he faced and how he overcame difficulties, even though there were times when he wanted to give up. This view very much echoes our 'Growth Mindset' approach to learning, that real learning can be challenging and difficult at times, but focus, tenacity and a 'can do' attitude can overcome any barriers. After the assembly, to the delight of the children, Dominic Mensah joined in some of the P.E lessons and modelled a very rigorous warm up – Mr O' Driscoll, who took part in one of these, told me that he aches in places that he has never ached before!
