#### Y4 SWIMMING LESSONS

Year 4 have been visiting Feel Good Centre for swimming lessons over the last two weeks. Each afternoon, they have worked with instructors to develop their swimming skills including floating, swimming strokes, breathing underwater and water safety. Y4 teachers have been incredibly impressed with the progress made by the children - well done!



### FIRE SAFETY WORKSHOP

This week, Y2 and Y5 have been visited by the Fire Brigade for fire safety workshops where they were taught what to do in an emergency if there is a fire and how to call 999. The children explored common fire hazards and the importance of never playing with matches and lighters. They also discussed the role of smoke alarms and how they keep homes safe from fire.

### **JEANS FOR GENES**

On Friday 22nd September, we took part in 'Jeans for Genes' day where the children came to school in jeans instead of their school trousers or skirts. The children explored the difference between 'jeans' and 'genes' and how people's lives can be affected by genetic conditions. We discussed the importance of raising awareness to support and also to educate more people on genetic conditions which are often very rare. Thank you for your kind donations to support this UK charity. We raised **£143** which will be donated to support the work of the charity this year.



#### FOREST SCHOOL

I am delighted to say that all classes will be working alongside a trained Forest School leader this term. Reception and Y1 will continue to have weekly sessions but Y2 - Y6 will also take part in a full afternoon of activities this term. I look forward to sharing photographs of the children in future newsletters and will share the dates of each year group so that the children have a Forest School kit on that day.



## ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY



Well done to **Year 2 Emmeline Pankhurst** with 99.03% **& Year 6 Anne Frank** with 98.15% who have won the attendance mascots this week.

The expected attendance level at St Saviour's is 97% and holidays during term time will not be authorised. All appointments, other than emergency ones, need to be booked outside of school hours. Other than in an emergency, a letter or appointment card must be presented at the Main Office ahead of the appointment for the school to be able to authorise the absence.

We have a 'Soft Start' for Y1 – Y6 where the school is open from 8:40am for children to arrive at school and settle ready for the start of the school day. Remember your child must be in school by 8:55am to avoid a late mark.

If your child is going to be absent due to illness, please call or leave a detailed message for the office team, including the reason your child is off sick.

## **SCHOOL DISMISSAL**

To keep children safe when you collect your child at the end of the day or after clubs, can I please ask they you keep them close and not let them run ahead or walk far behind you.



If you have arranged for your child to be collected by another parent, friend or relative, please ensure that you have informed the school office so that the class teacher can be made aware and can safely dismiss your child. Please be patient if the teacher needs to check arrangements - the safety of your children is of the most importance.



# **BIKES AND SCOOTERS**



Please can I remind parents that bikes and scooters should not be left overnight on the school grounds. Any bikes or scooters left will have to be removed from the racks to minimise risk of theft by leaving them visible overnight. If you are unable to take your child's bike or scooter home on the same day, please inform the school office to see if an arrangement can be made.





## **AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS**

After School Clubs will start on Monday 25th September. Please ensure that you have made payment to secure your child's place.

We try and offer a range of clubs for children to engage in and are always looking for new ideas. If you know any individuals or groups who would be interested in running clubs, please get in contact with the school office. We are particularly interested in music, language and dance and drama specialists to enable us to expand our offer.

## **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

We like to see all of our children wearing the correct uniform; it helps them to be proud of their school and creates a sense of identity and belonging. Please ensure that your child has the correct school uniform and PE kit and that all items are clearly labelled with their full name. Footwear includes plain black school shoes (no trainers) and black plimsolls or plain black trainers for PE lessons.

Can I please remind you not to send your child to school with a large rucksack as we do not have the space to store them in the classrooms. Our school book bags are the perfect size for reading books, reading records, a break time snack and a water bottle.




## **READING RECORDS**

Your child has been given a new yellow reading record and a banded reading book for them to take home.

To encourage a love for reading and to support the development and consolidation of their reading skills, we ask that you read with your child or listen to your child read everyday. This can be for just 10 or 15 minutes and recorded in their reading log.

Any other books that the children read for pleasure can also be recorded in their log and will be celebrated by their class teacher.
