#### YOUNG TRANSFORMERS SPRING

This week Reception & Year 1 took part in a storytelling workshop with West End in Schools. #### **ROAD SAFETY**

Waltham Forest have notified us of parents and carers frequently using the junctions of Acacia Road and Verulam Avenue as drop-off and pick-up points for their children. ## YEAR 5 CLASS CORNER

In Year 5, we are still working on reversible and irreversible changes in our science lessons. In previous weeks, we learnt that the release of gas or a change in temperature are signs that a chemical reaction had taken place. This week, the focus was on understanding that they can also be identified through colour changes when certain reactants are mixed together.



We used iodine to help us identify which types of food contain starch and which do not because iodine turns a very dark purple when it comes into contact with starch. We started the lesson with a demonstration of iodine drops in a jar of normal water and a few drops of iodine in a jar which had a solution of water and corn starch. The reaction was instantaneous and like magic. Can you think of any colour changes that happen in nature as a result of a chemical reaction?

## **SCIENCE WEEK 2024**

We have a very exciting event ahead of us: Science Week 2024 and the theme for this year is Time!

'Time is key to so many discoveries in science, technology, engineering and maths. Evolution looks at how plants and animals changed over a long period of time, the Earth's movements show us why we have seasons and different time zones. In fact, the study of all the celestial bodies in our universe are centred around time; we talk about stars and planets being light years away – the distance light travels over a year.'

During Science week, we aim to develop pupils' science capital with a range of activities.

### 1. Workshop and visitors

Pupils will experience a fun science workshop by Silly Science and they will be visited by a STEM ambassador who will talk to children about the theme, Time. Look out for photos in the newsletter!

### 2. Science Symposium - Thursday 21st March 2024

We would like to invite all parents and carers to join the children on Thursday 21st March 2024 from 3.45pm - 5pm for our big science event. During the event, pupils and their parents and carers can take part in lots of hands-on science activities and be challenged to try easy experiments at home.

For the event, all children in our school are invited to enter the Science Symposium competition by creating a science project at home. These projects will be showcased in the school hall for all to view during. Winners will be chosen from each key stage and awarded a prize. The deadline for the projects is on Monday 18th March 2024.

### 3. Dress-up day - Friday 22nd March 2024

Pupils can come to school dressed as something to do with science! During a special assembly, pupils will show their outfits and some pupils will be invited to talk about their costumes. Please support them in choosing and researching their concepts. The main purpose of the activity is to develop pupils' science capital, meaning they can learn something different and interesting which they can share with everyone. Therefore, we would like to discourage pupils from dressing up as scientists unless they are researching a specific field or career in science.
