Dear Parents and Carers,

What a fantastic week it has been across our classrooms! The atmosphere around school has been filled with energy, curiosity, and collaboration, as every child continues to make a positive contribution to their lessons and the wider school community. It has been wonderful to see pupils engaging so thoughtfully in their learning—asking great questions, sharing ideas confidently, and supporting one another with genuine kindness. Teachers have been full of praise for the children's focus, creativity, and resilience, and it's clear that our learners are really developing a strong sense of pride in their work and in each other.



A real highlight of the week was our Star of the Week assembly, where we celebrated another group of amazing Young Transformers. These children were recognised not only for their achievements but for the values they show every day—kindness, effort, positivity, and care for others. It's always lovely to see how proudly they accept their awards and how enthusiastically their classmates cheer them on. The growing number of Young Transformers each week shows how much our pupils encourage one another to do their best, and it's wonderful to see those small, positive actions making such a big impact on our school community.

Next week brings something very exciting—the start of our Dragon's Den class rounds! Pupils have been busy developing their innovative ideas since summer, either individually or working in pairs, ready to pitch to their classmates and teachers. It's been fantastic to see their creativity and teamwork in action as they prepare to share their concepts, designs, and business plans. These sessions give children a chance to practise real-world skills—persuasive communication, collaboration, and problem-solving—and we can already sense the buzz of anticipation building. We can't wait to see the confidence and imagination that will shine through as each child steps up to present their pitch and compete to win their class round.

Our class assemblies this week have focused on two important and thought-provoking themes: "Write down positive things that you can learn from a mistake" and "Show ways you can demonstrate forgiveness." Both topics encouraged children to reflect deeply on how they respond to challenges and how their actions affect others. It was inspiring to hear pupils talk about mistakes as opportunities to learn, rather than setbacks, and to share examples of how they have turned difficult moments into valuable lessons. The discussions about forgiveness were equally moving, with children offering practical ideas for showing they have forgiven someone—through kind words, friendly gestures, or simply giving people another chance. The reflections and responses this week showed great emotional awareness and a growing sense of empathy among our pupils, which is wonderful to see.

As we end another busy and rewarding week, I want to thank you all for the continued encouragement and support you give your children at home. It makes such a difference to see the confidence and positivity they bring into school each day. We are so proud of the progress being made by every child and of the warm, inclusive spirit that continues to make our school such a special place to learn and grow.






