We hope that many children are already beginning to think about their science projects. The competition is always a wonderful opportunity for pupils to investigate ideas, ask questions and present their discoveries. Between now and then we wish everyone the very best as they begin preparing their experiments and investigations. We cannot wait to see the creativity and curiosity that our young scientists bring to the challenge.
