Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been another wonderfully busy week in school, filled with enriching experiences and exciting opportunities for the children across many year groups. It has been lovely to see the enthusiasm with which the pupils have embraced each activity and the confidence they show when trying new things.

Some of our Year 5 and Year 6 pupils took part in an inspiring sitting volleyball session. The children learned about the sport and its connection to inclusive and Paralympic competition, while developing teamwork and communication skills. It was fantastic to see how quickly they adapted to the format of the game and how supportive they were of one another throughout the session.

Year 4 enjoyed an engaging STEM workshop, where they explored scientific thinking and problem solving through practical activities - including circuits. A quick reminder to families regarding the electrical circuits that children may have brought home from their recent STEM activities. When these are no longer needed, please ensure that they are disposed of responsibly, particularly any batteries that may be included. Batteries should be removed and recycled safely according to local guidance. Thank you for helping us to support safe and environmentally responsible disposal.

Across the school, the children have also been enjoying a number of creative and movement based workshops this week. As part of Dance Days, Year 3 took part in a vibrant Bollywood dancing workshop, learning energetic routines and exploring the rhythm and storytelling within the dance style. The hall was full of movement, colour and smiles as the children threw themselves into the experience with great enthusiasm.

Meanwhile, Year 5 had the opportunity to take part in a West End Musical Theatre workshop, also led by Dance Days. The session gave pupils a taste of the energy and performance style of musical theatre, encouraging them to express themselves through movement and performance. It was fantastic to see their confidence grow as they worked together to bring the routines to life.

Our youngest pupils in Reception have also had a special experience this week through their Mindful Movement sessions. These activities help children to develop balance, focus and calmness while exploring movement in a fun and supportive environment. The sessions are a lovely way to encourage wellbeing and self awareness in our youngest learners.

Looking ahead to next week, we will be marking Red Nose Day. On Friday, children are invited to wear something red to support this fantastic cause. Red Nose Day is a wonderful opportunity for us to come together as a community, raise awareness and support important charitable work while also having a bit of fun.

We are incredibly proud to celebrate Apollo, who has received a Young Transformers Award for his wonderful act of kindness.

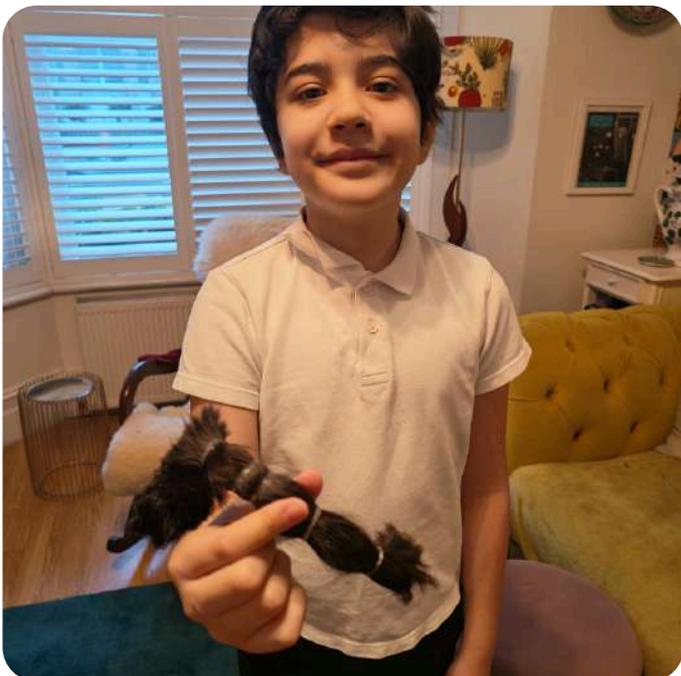
