Dear Parent/Carers,

Ms Tolliday, our Deputy Headteacher, would normally be the next person to become involved, followed by me, as Headteacher, if further support is required.

In terms of catching up with teachers, may I kindly ask that you do not engage teachers in conversations during dismissal time. We need to remain especially vigilant when sending children home, and our priority must always be ensuring that every child leaves school safely and is handed over to the appropriate adult.

Please could I also ask you to remain a little way back from the class at dismissal time, so that the teacher has a clear view of the adults waiting and can calmly and safely hand your child over to you.

Thank you, as always, for your understanding and cooperation. Working together in this way helps us to keep our children safe while ensuring that we are able to support you and your child as effectively as possible.

I hope you all have a weekend full of play, fun and laughter, and I look forward to seeing you all on Monday!
