#### HACKNEY PARTNERSHIP

We know that many young people in London between the ages of fourteen and eighteen are vulnerable and at risk for many complex reasons. Homelessness for young people is on the increase in London and we understand that we need to target those families and children who are at risk so that support can be offered well before a child is without a family home. Schools often can be a beacon of hope for children who may struggle in life and secondary schools can be best placed to support these families and children. We have a partnership in place to work closely with Skinner Academy and would like to reach out to our school community to ask for donations to enable a young person to feel less anxious about school and to support their chances to excel in school and beyond.

We have asked what would make the greatest difference in the short term and on Wednesday we shared a letter with you listing items that would be gratefully accepted as donations. Any donations, no matter the size can make a difference and if you are in a position to be able to help, we would be very grateful. Donations can be dropped off in the school foyer and more valuable items can be given to the office team to store.
