Dear Parents and Carers,

The children have come back to school with so much zest and have been working hard over the last two weeks. There have been lots of assessments taking place this week and I want to say a huge 'Well Done!' to all of the children who showed tremendous effort. The children have also been very busy in their lessons and Y2 would like to share some of their learning this week. In their science lessons, they have been exploring the school grounds to identify deciduous and evergreen shrubs and trees. They found Holly (evergreen) and Silver Birch (deciduous) alongside many more! In their art lessons, they have been using watercolour washes and wax resistance to create coastlines. Y6 have started to practise for their end of year performance and some children also took part in Bike-ability this week.



SPECIAL VISITORS

On Wednesday, we had a special visitor from Depaul come in and lead assembly. Depaul are a national homelessness charity with a focus on young people. Their aim is to end homelessness and change the lives of those affected by it. They prevent young people becoming homeless by providing shelter and support in a crisis, rebuilding family relationships, and teaching children about the risks of homelessness and where to turn for help. Carolyn spoke about the amazing work the charity does and how our Seeds of Change work would be supporting them.

On Thursday, we were visited by Mrs Daly, one of our parents, who is a successful photographer and picture editor. She delivered a Dreamcatchers assembly to the children, opening their eyes to career opportunities and inspiring their futures. Thank you!

TED TALKS

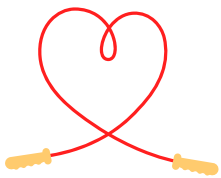

This special evening promises to be a truly inspiring showcase of the children's hard work, creativity and confidence.

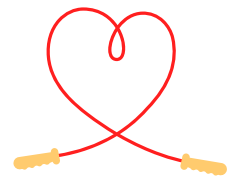

After-School Movie Nights

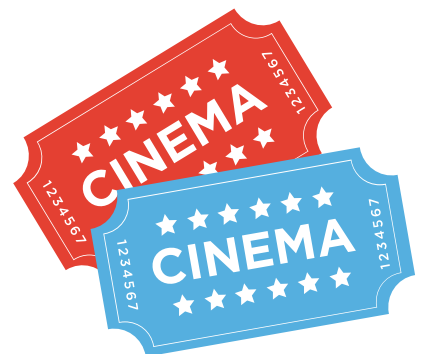
KS1 Movie Night: Monday, 23rd June
