## TED TALKS

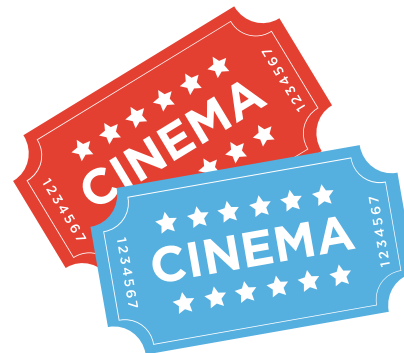

**Bacalhau com Natas**  
 Chef: Rhianne

Prep time: 25 minutes  
 Cook time: 50 minutes  
 Serves: 4-6 people

**Ingredients**

- 1 lb (450 g) salted cod (bacalhau), soaked for 24-48 hours (changing water 2-3 times)
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 1 large onion, thinly sliced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 bay leaf
- 2 tbsp butter
- 2 tbsp all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cups milk, warmed
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/4 tsp freshly grated nutmeg (optional)
- Salt and black pepper, to taste
- 4 large potatoes, peeled and cut into small cubes
- Vegetable oil for frying potatoes
- 1/2 cup grated cheese (optional)
- Fresh parsley, chopped (for garnish)



**Jamaican Jerk Chicken**  
 Chef: Robyn

Prep time: 20 minutes  
 Cook time: 60 minutes  
 Serves: 4 people

**Ingredients**

**For the Chicken:**

- 4 bone-in, skin-on chicken legs (or thighs, drumsticks, or breasts)

**For the Jerk Marinade:**

- 4 green onions (scallions), chopped
- 4 cloves garlic
- 1 thumb-sized piece of ginger, peeled and chopped
- 2-3 Scotch bonnet peppers (or habanero), seeds removed for less heat
- 2 tablespoons fresh thyme leaves (or 1 tbsp dried thyme)
- 2 tablespoons ground allspice
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- Juice of 1 lime
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons white vinegar
