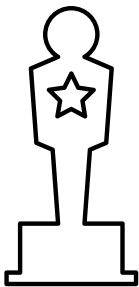
Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you again for all that you do to support your children and our school community. Wishing you all a restful and enjoyable weekend ahead.

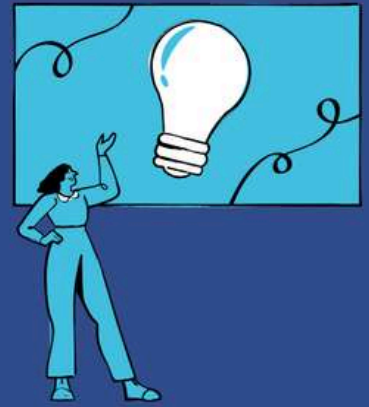
